The event is the creation of a group of local individuals and organizations committed to exploring these expressions through the arts and conversation.

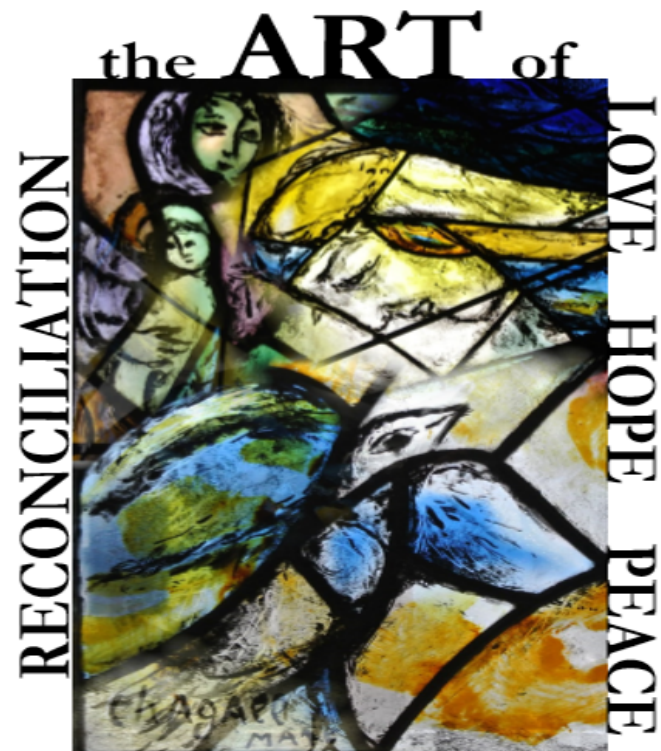
